Dear Mr. Chairman:

In compliance with 10 United States Code § 222a, this letter provides the U.S. Cyber Command's (USCYBERCOM) FY 2021 Unfunded Priorities List (UPL).

USCYBERCOM's enclosed FY 2021 UPL addresses the most pressing Cyber Mission Force (CMF) requirements not contained in the FY 2021 President's Budget (PB) Request. Our three UPL priorities continue efforts to enhance lethality, increase partnerships, and expand capabilities against near-peer competitors.

This UPL totals \$106 million and includes funding to enhance Hunt Forward missions for the Cyber National Mission Force (CNMF); increase access for the CMF to deter, fight, and win; and improve capabilities to secure the Department of Defense Information Network (DODIN). Should additional resources be available, I ask your committee to support the priorities detailed in Enclosure A to help us strengthen military readiness and alliances, secure the homeland from cyberspace attack, and advance national interests.

Thank you for your continued and unwavering support. I look forward to working closely together on enhancing USCYBERCOM's lethality in support of the National Defense Strategy (NDS).
